## 21 September, 2021: Visit of Girl Students from MJAS, Ajmer

Faculties responded the students' queries. A session was organized for students' interactions with Prof. Neeraj Gupta ji, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of the university. ## **CMS Book Discussion Series**

The Department of Culture and Media Studies initiated a Book Discussion Series to explore and discuss scholarly contributions in the field of media and communication studies for the benefits of students, scholars, faculty members and media practitioners. Total of six discussions were held.

### 24 September, 2021: First Book Discussion

The Department of Culture and Media Studies, Central University of Rajasthan organized an Online Book Discussion program on 24th September 2021. In this program, Prof. Srinivas Raj Melkote, Emeritus Professor, School of Media and Communication, Bowling Green State University, US and Prof. Arvind Singhal, Professor of Communication, Department of Communication, The University of Texas at El Paso, US were invited to talk about their edited volume entitled 'Handbook of Communication and Development' (2021) published by Edward-Elgar.





Prof. Srinivas R Melkote, who is a renowned expert in the field of development communication, discussed about the role of media and communication in development and social change. Prof. Melkote said that role of development communication in today's context is to empower people, increase their participation in development programs and achieve social justice in development. Further, he said that objective of development is freedom from abject poverty and inequalities and freedom to live a meaningful life.

Prof. Jagdish Jadhav, Head (i/c), Department of Culture and Media Studies gave the inaugural speech. Program was moderated by Ms. Aditi Khare, student of the Department. Dr. Nicholas Lakra, Coordinator of Department proposed Vote of Thanks to the guests and participants. Organizing committee members include Dr. Pranta Pratik Patnaik, Dr. Neeru Prasad and Dr. Anoop Kumar. More than 85 participants including students, research scholars and faculties from Central University of Rajasthan and other institutes attended the program.





#### 01 October, 2021: Second Book Discussion

The Department of Culture and Media Studies, Central University of Rajasthan organized a Book Discussion program on 'Many Voices, Many Worlds: Critical Perspectives on Community Media in India' (Sage, 2021) edited by Dr. Faiz Ullah, Prof. Anjali Monteiro and Prof. K.P. Jayasankar. This program was held on 1st October 2021 in online mode. Anjali Monteiro and K.P. Jayasankar are retired professors from the School of Media and Cultural Studies, Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS), Mumbai. Dr. Faiz Ullah is working with the same school.

Invited speaker, Dr. Faiz Ullah talked about the significant role played by community media for the marginalized people. He stressed the need for democratization of the public sphere and that is possible through building up community media networks. Prof. Anjali Monteiro and Prof. K.P.Jayasankar, the coeditors of the book emphasized that community media has always been couched under the blanket term 'development' and now the time has come to question the





idea of development itself. They also outlined the four different sections in the book. It begins with problematizing the concept of 'community' in community media followed by examples from tribal communities, Dalits, Muslims and Women in different regions of the country who have got a platform through community media to make their voices heard. The three speakers also mentioned that we need to rethink the concept of community media through theatre, photography and other means of communication available for participation of the people.

Dr. Nicholas Lakra, Coordinator of Department welcomed the invited speakers and participants. Program was moderated by Mr. Prateek Kumar Vishwakarma, student of the department. Faculties of the department Dr. Anoop Kumar and Dr. Neeru Prasad introduced the book and editors respectively. 
### 22 October, 2021: Third Book Discussion

The Department of Culture and Media Studies, Central University of Rajasthan organized a Book Discussion program on 'Media Economics and Management' authored by Dr. Sathya Prakash Elavarthi who works as an Associate Professor at the Department of Communication, University of Hyderabad and Dr. Sunitha Chitrapu who is an independent media researcher based in Mumbai. The book is published by Routledge, India. This program was held on 22 October, 2021 in online mode.





Invited speakers, Dr. Sathya Prakash Elavarthi and Dr. Sunitha Chitrapu talked about different chapters of their book. Dr. Sathya Prakash Elavarthi said that there is a need to look at media as an economic institution as well in today's context. Dr. Sunitha Chitrapu told that the book covers various aspects relating to the economics and management of media institutions and media industries in India. In the book, management issues of four major media industry sectors in India which include newspaper publishing, television broadcasting, film and digital media industries have been examined. Further, the book covers the discussions on economic forces crucial for functioning of media institutions and industries. Editors underlined that this book is an attempt to formalize the field of media economics and management in the discipline of journalism and mass communication in India for education and research purposes. This book is a useful resource for media students and educators.



The book is published by Bloomsbury, India. This program was held on 28 October, 2021 in online mode.



Dr. Dev Nath Pathak opined that ordinariness is a complex structure that needs to be understood as a meshy embodied experience. In our pursuit for extraordinariness,



we have forgotten to appreciate the mundane everyday life and practices. He argued that in order to make the ordinary as the extraordinary, one needs to develop critical reasoning and question the conditioned cultural practices in our society. His key argument in the discussion was that "Ordinary never disappears" rather we have made it invisible due to the spectacle and lure of being extraordinary.


#### 12 November, 2021: Fifth Book Discussion









Invited speakers provided the book description and introduced different chapters.

This book deals with various issues related to community radio like radio policies, spectrum management, role of community radio in disasters/emergencies, gender



issues, among others. Prof. Malik and Prof. Pavarala emphasized that community radio stations need to adopt a culture of self-regulation and peer-review as a means to quality assurance and enhancement of integrity. Discussing the importance and relevance of community radio, Prof. Kanchan Malik noted that community radio



promotes community participation, culture, local languages/dialects and plurality of views. Community radio bridges the digital divide by extending the benefits of information and communication technology to rural people and unreached and deprived communities. Prof. Vinod Pavarala said that the book was an attempt to recognize contributions of community radio stations in the South Asian region.

Introduction of the book and invited speakers was given by Dr. Anoop Kumar and Dr. Neeru Prasad respectively who are assistant professors in the Department. 


### 18 November, 2021: Sixth Book Discussion

The Department of Culture and Media Studies, Central University of Rajasthan organized an online Book Discussion program on 'Muscular India: Masculinity, Mobility & the New Middle Class' authored by Dr. Michiel Baas who is a Senior Research Fellow at the Max Planck Institute for Social Anthropology (Halle), Germany. This program was held on 18 November, 2021. Based on his 10 years study on the gym culture in India, Dr. Michiel Baas talked about the dreams and aspirations of the gym trainers in metropolitan cities towards upward mobility in the social hierarchy. He stressed the ways in which the male body-builders and gym trainers fit into a new urban India through physical culture of their bodies. He talked how class matters the most in the trainer-client relationship rather than caste, a significant marker of emerging new India in urban areas. Baas also mentioned about the rise of gym culture in the small towns and cities influenced by the Hindi film industry where actors flaunt their six-pack abs. Towards the end of his talk, he also



mentioned about the pitfalls of the gym culture where being muscular enough lead the youth to take recourse to steroids and other harmful substances.







# 15-30 September, 2021: Preparation for UGC NET Exam in Mass Communication and Journalism






## 18 April, 2022: Masterclass on Photography







## 24 June, 2022: Webinar on 'Career Prospects in Media Industry'
