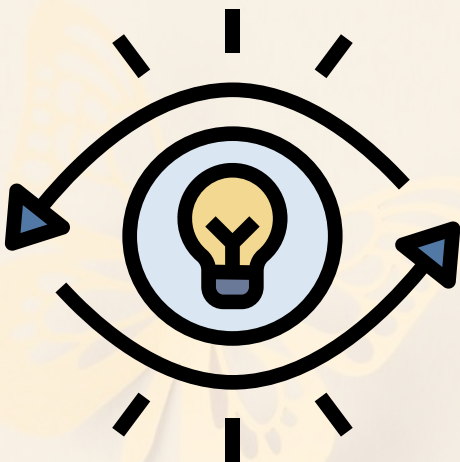


Introduction

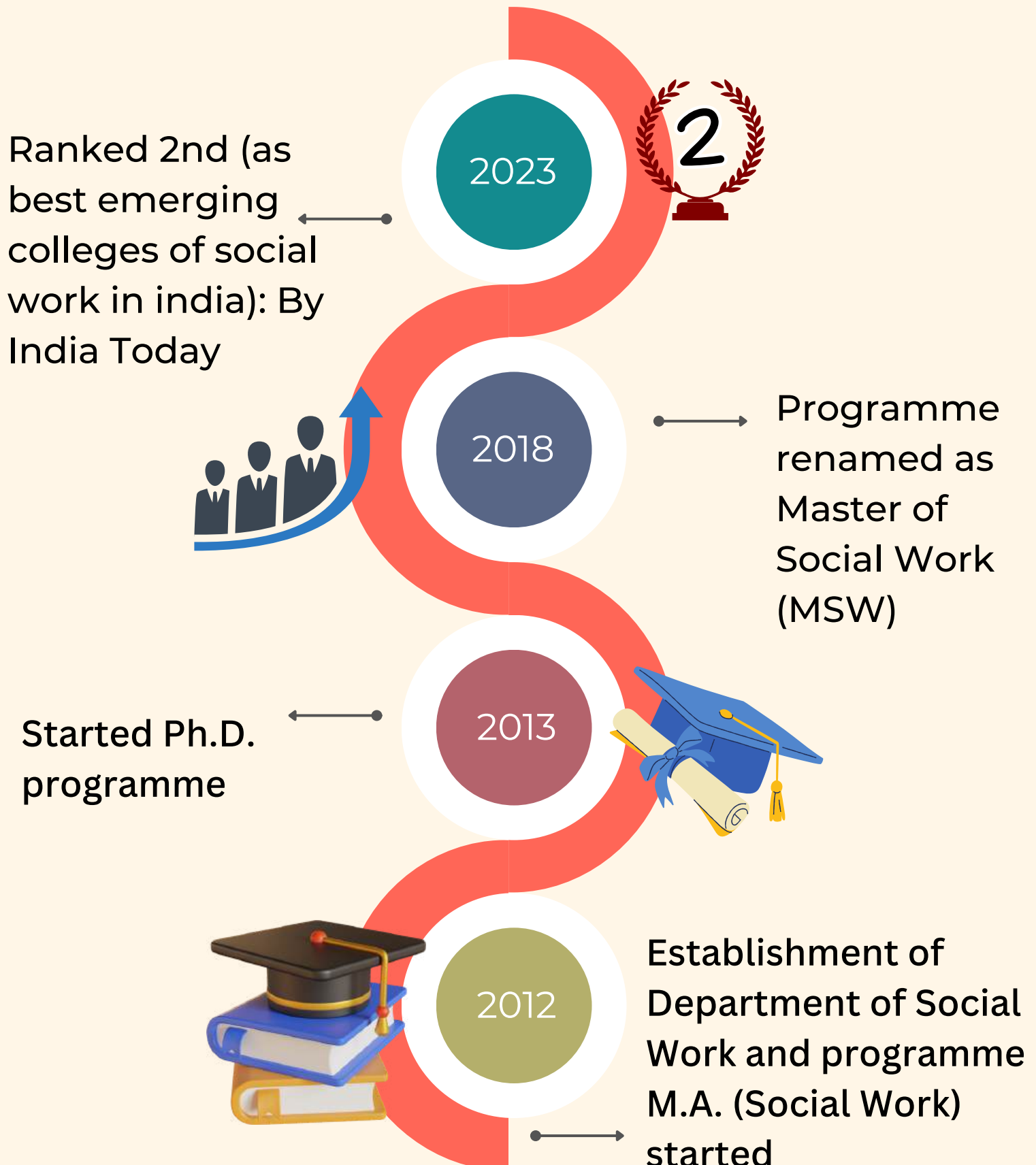
The department mission is to develop: "Globally competent, socially significant, and locally relevant trained Social Work professionals."

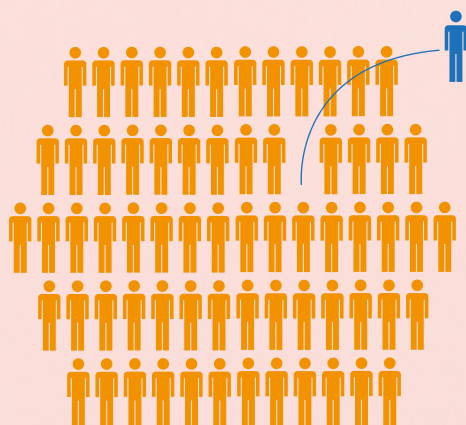

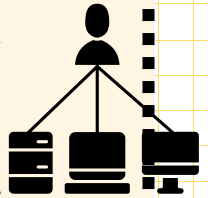

Concurrent Field work

Concurrent fieldwork is a key component of our curriculum, where we apply social work theories in real-world settings. In the first semester, we work with NGOs, and in the 2nd & 3rd semesters, we focus on community settings. This hands-on experience helps us bridge theory with practice, enhancing our skills and professional development.

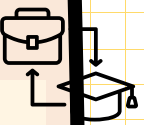


Summer Internship

In the 3rd semester, students are required to complete a Summer Internship, offering hands-on experience in various settings such as NGOs, hospitals, government agencies or corporate organizations, based on individual interests. This internship provides valuable exposure to real-world applications at a national level.

Block Placement

In the 4th semester, students are required to complete their block placements, offering hands-on experience in various settings such as NGOs, hospitals, or corporate organizations, based on individual interests. This provides them valuable exposure to real-world applications at a national level.



Individual Conference

An individual conference is a student-supervisor interaction to address fieldwork issues, analyze tasks, and evaluate learning while enhancing recording skills.

Group Conference

A group conference allows students to share fieldwork experiences, explore diverse settings, discuss issues, and solve problems collaboratively. It develops teamwork, presentation skills, and the ability to give and use feedback constructively.

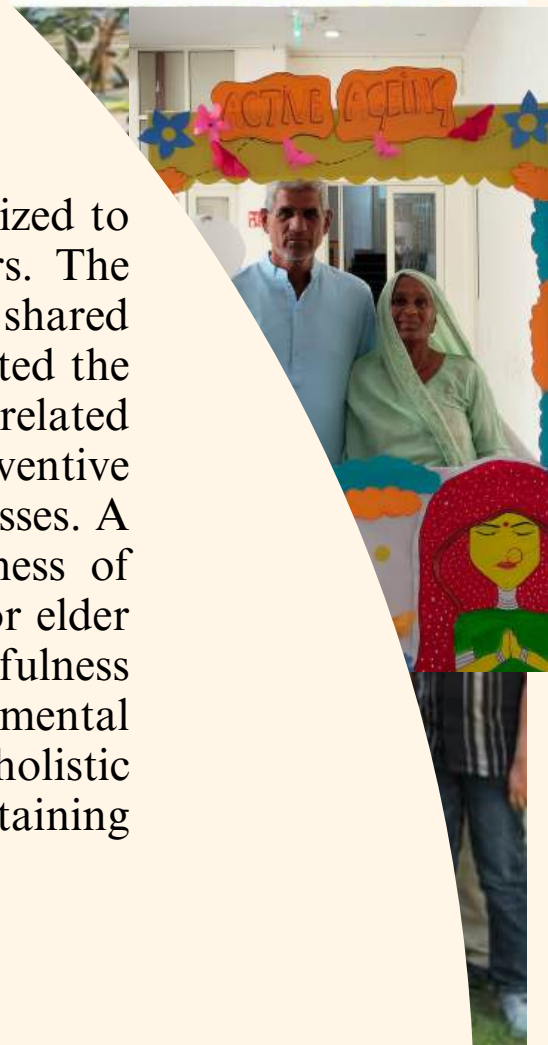


WORKSHOP

OBSERVING WORLD SOCIAL WORK DAY 2024

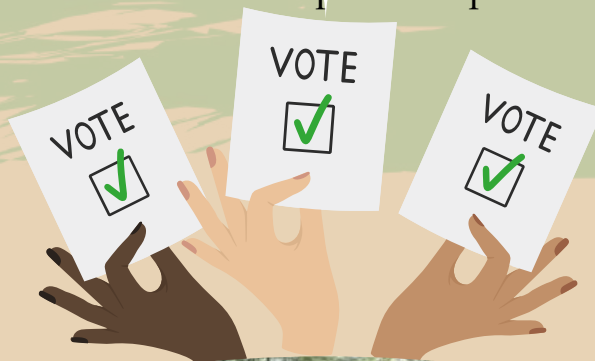

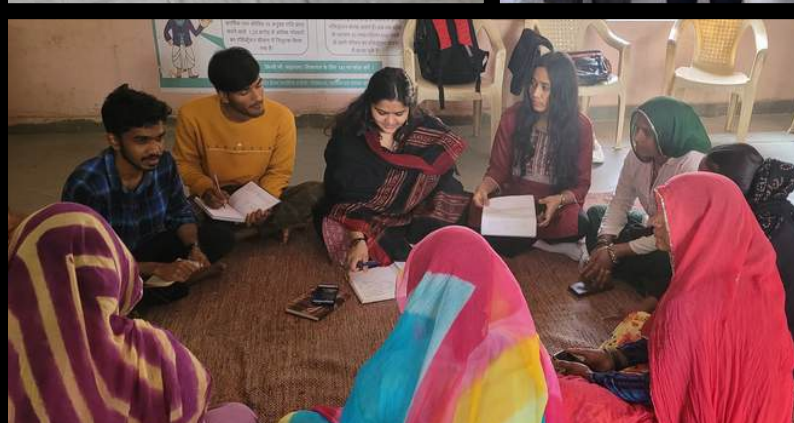

The companies are invited for a preplacement talk for the batch. This aids the students in making an informed choice regarding the organisation.

03.

RESUME SHORTLISTING



In this, recruiters (organisation/companies) select students or job seekers through resume screening, aiming to connect candidates with employers efficiently.

04.

SELECTION PROCESS



Students participate in written tests (aptitude/technical), group discussions, and multiple rounds of interviews to assess their knowledge, skills, and suitability for the roles.

05.

PLACEMENT



After the successful selection, students receive a formal letter from the organization offering them the job. Upon acceptance, they complete the necessary documentation and join the company/organisation on the specified date.

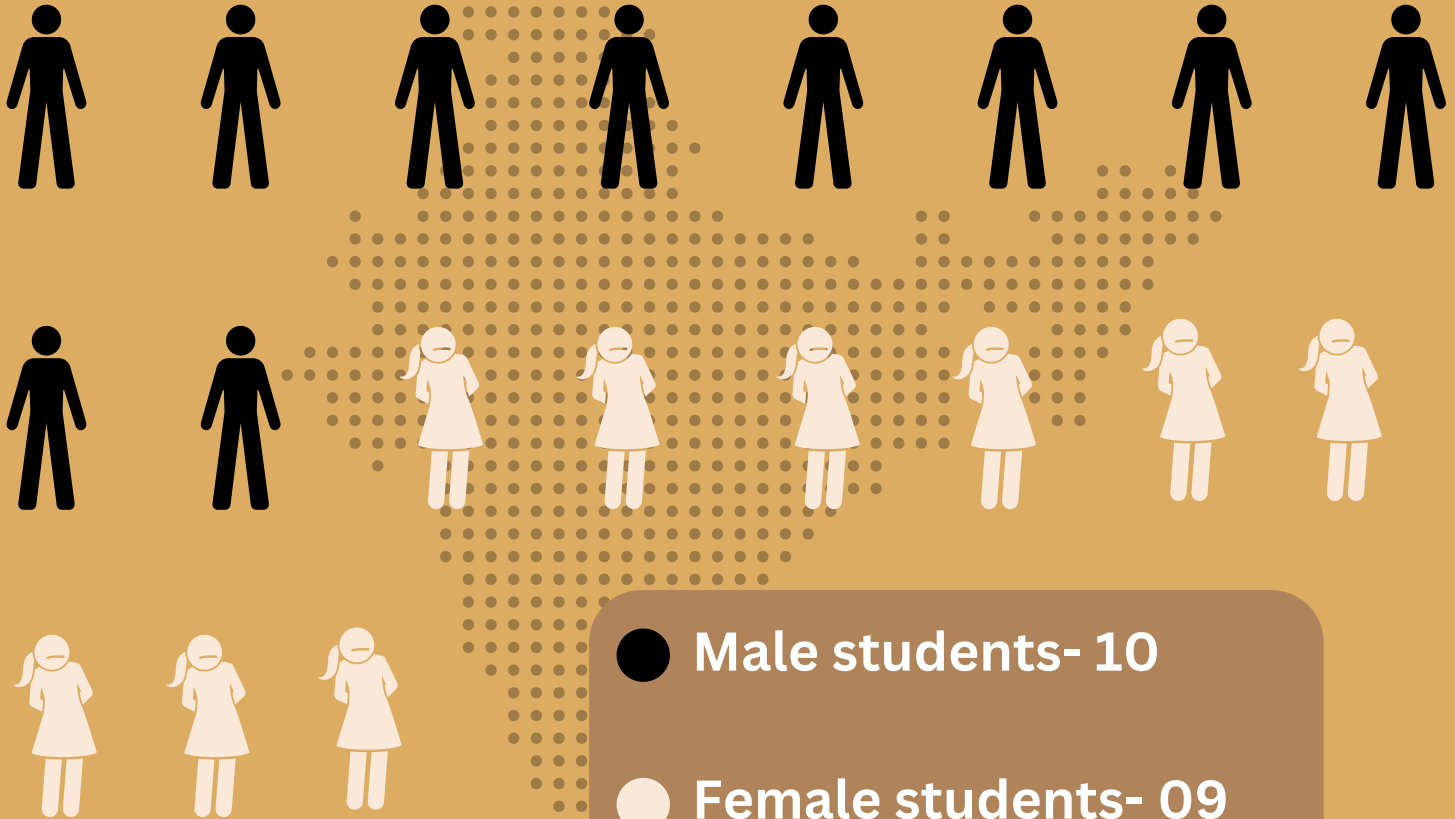
