## RULES REGARDING REIMBURSEMENT OF MEDICAL EXPENSES

All medical expenses (except those incurred on tonics, denture false teeth, surgical appliances) incurred on the advice of the Medical Officer, of the Institution or, where there is no Medical Officer, of the Head of the Institution, where will be reimbursed by the Government of India.

2. If a scholar remains in Hospital for a period of one month or longer, his scholarship will be reduced by 50% for the limiting period spent by him by him in the Hospital.

3. Cases not requiring a specialists treatment or which do

- not involve danger to file should, so far as possible be referred to Government Hospitals for treatment. Cases involving danger to life or limp etc. or requring special treatment, may however, be referrred to private practioners at the dise creation of the Head of the Institution subject to the Canditions that (i) adequate facilities were not available at Government hospital or (ii) such facilities as were available there would not be availed of in view of the emergency.
- 4. Medical charges, if any, paid out of the emergency grant should be recouped later from Government after submission of relevant medical bills with & vouchers duly countersigned by
- the Head of the Institution.
