For example, a student first appears in the regular examination for a course and, upon failing, applies for re-evaluation. If the student still does not pass, they appear for the back paper examination in the following semester. In case of failure again, they subsequently apply for re-evaluation of the back paper. Consequently, the same course undergoes multiple cycles of re-evaluation, leading to repetitive processing of applications.</p> <p><b>Delay in Result Declaration:</b></p> <p>The nominated external examiners are, in several instances, not showing adequate interest in evaluating the answer scripts. As a result, we are often compelled to re-assign the evaluation work to alternative examiners. In some cases, despite repeat-</p>

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	<p>ed reminders through phone calls and emails, the evaluated scripts or marks are not submitted in a timely manner, which ultimately leads to delays in the declaration of results.</p> <p><b>Student Grievances:</b> Students frequently raise grievances through emails and online portals (DARPG, UGC, etc.) regarding delays in re-evaluation results. Some students also express concerns about their eligibility for promotion, next-semester registration, or award of degree. Due to the repeated cycle of re-evaluation and back paper applications for the same course, the declaration of re-evaluation results gets delayed, leading to further confusion about academic progression and admission to higher studies. In several cases, students have even written to the University stating that such delays are adversely affecting their future.</p> <p><b>Concerns Regarding Transparency and System Efficiency:</b> Repeated re-evaluation requests for the same paper often create a perception-related issue about transparency and fairness of the evaluation process, even though the system maintains complete procedural integrity. Due to the repeated cycle of re-evaluation and back paper applications for the same course, transparency issues are arising in the overall examination process.</p> <p><b>Availability of Multiple Improvement Opportunities:</b> Since students now have the facility to appear in back papers every semester until they clear the course, sufficient academic opportunities are already available for grade improvement.</p> <p>In view of the above points and with an aim to ensure a faster, transparent, and system-driven examination and result process, it is proposed that the re-evaluation facility for only Back Paper and Special End Semester Examinations may be discontinued henceforth.</p> <p><b>Resolution: To ensure a faster, transparent and system-driven examination and result process, the proposal regarding discontinuation of re-evaluation facility for only Back Paper and Special End Semester Examinations is approved by the Academic Council.
