The webinar was focused on National Professional Standards for Teachers (NPST), its Needs & concerns and a Roadmap for implementation.

There were two sessions in this programme; the First session was organized on the subtheme "NPST: Need & Concerns", and the second session was organized on the subtheme "NPST: Road Map for Implementation".

### **First Session**

Subtheme: "NPST: Need & Concerns"

The programme started at 12:00 pm with the welcome address by Dr Anjali Sharma, convenor of the National Webinar and Head and Dean School of Education, Central University of Rajasthan. The dignitaries on the event were **Prof. Saket Kushwaha**, **Vice-Chancellor**, **Rajeev Gandhi University**, **Arunachal Pradesh**, **Prof. Saroj Sharma Chairperson**, **National Institute of Open Schooling and Prof. Neeraj Gupta**, **Vice-Chancellor** (i/c), **Central University of Rajasthan**.

The first session was moderated by Dr Rina Godara, Assistant Professor, Department of Education, Central University of Rajasthan.

Dr Anjali Sharma delivered opening remarks and an introduction to the programme. She highlighted the key points of the webinar. Also, she thanked the Ministry of Education along with National Council for Teacher Education Officials, Shri Santosh Kumar Sarangi, IAS Chairperson, NCTE Mrs Kesang Y Sherpa, Member Secretary, NCTE and Mr Dinesh Kumar Chaturvedi, Under Secretary, NCTE, for choosing us to organize this one-day National Webinar.

**Prof. Neeraj Gupta, Vice-Chancellor (i/c),** Central University of Rajasthan, also welcomed the invited eminent speaker and expressed his gratitude for their presence for gracing this event.

Subject Experts, Prof. Saket Kushwaha, Vice-Chancellor, Rajeev Gandhi University, Arunachal Pradesh and Prof. Saroj Sharma, Chairperson, National Institute of Open Schooling, were the dignitaries invited for the first session of the webinar.

At the starting of the session, **Prof. Neeraj Gupta, Vice-Chancellor (i/c), Central University of Rajasthan**, said that it is quite interesting that due to online connectivity, we could be able to connect from Arunachal Pradesh to Rajasthan. He stated about the theme and subthemes of the webinar that it is the most critical topic of concern when we are talking about the implementation of the National Education Policy 2020. Skill and attitude are the two significant areas of concern that are missing among the teachers. In our education system, a teacher is sent to any institution without any training, so there is a need to train our teachers in these two specific areas, i.e. skill and attitude, before sending them to any institution.

**Prof. Saket Kushwaha, Vice-Chancellor, Rajeev Gandhi University, Arunachal Pradesh** focused on the ground reality related to teacher education institutions. He said that in our universities, whether it is Central University or State University, the ratio of teachers is not managed. Due to the scarcity of teachers, institutes fail to release teachers for better training. He also talked about APAR (Annual Performance Appraisal Report). According to him, there is a need to look into the dynamics of differential treatment. He also emphasized that training is also required for future teachers so that they may be able to develop and synthesize the problems from the raw data. He said that teachers fail to build curiosity among our students, so we need to train our teachers in this aspect.

In the second part of the session Dr. Kanak Sharma, Assistant Professor, Department of Education, Central University of Rajasthan welcomed and introduced the second speaker of the session

The second speaker of the session, **Prof. Saroj Sharma, Chairperson, National Institute of Open Schooling**, started her session with the Status of Teacher in Ancient times. She said that the teacher in the olden days shaped the future of society and was highly revered and superior to God. He was most learned. She also traced the development in the field of education by referring to various commissions and committees. She stated that in the 21<sup>st</sup>-century educator, we are looking for characteristics such as adaptor, communicator, learner, visionary, leader, model, collaborator and risk-taker. She defined professional standards as a set of principles, ethics and behaviours that members of a particular professional group need to adapt.

The speaker referenced Sustainable Development Goals (SDG 2030) on professional standards of teachers, which states, "By 2030, substantially increase the supply of qualified teachers, including through international cooperation for teacher training in developing countries, especially least developed countries and small island developing states." It also talks about the "Existence of National Quality Standards for Teachers."

She also discussed NPST and highlighted that there has to be motivation for teachers to enhance teacher education quality, and the high respect for teachers and high status of teaching needs to be restored. These things need to be kept in mind while preparing for NPST. It should focus on Expectation, Competency, Standard for Performance Appraisal and Designing of Preservice teacher education Programme. UNESCO in 2019 also gave domains of professional teaching standards: Knowledge and understanding, practice (Pedagogy) and Teaching Relations (Professional Relationships). Towards the end, the speaker focused on the needs and concerns of the NPST like;

- we need to define the roles of teachers,
- provide the framework for self-learning and self-evaluation,
- make explicit the qualities of a 21<sup>st</sup>-century teacher,
- raise the profession's status, and demonstrate the appropriate level of professional knowledge, practice, and engagement.

What is the way forward now? How do we move ahead? For this, the speaker discussed four professional standard resources: Professional Standard Framework for teachers, Professional Standard Self-development Guide, Professional Standard Assessment tools, Professional Standard Research tools.

The speaker shared her experiences at NIOS how they are working towards the professional development of their teachers. She also shared about the Virtual school initiated by NIOS and NDEAR Scheme of Government. She believed that teachers should also work for their professional development. In these times of pandemic, the teachers have worked on their capacity building and equipped themselves with the new technology. There is an utter need to keep on working on the professional development of teachers. We need to work on their capacity development and ensure that they are ready with 21<sup>st</sup>-century skills.

At the end of the session, the speaker answered the queries of the participants. The programme wrapped up around 1:45 pm. The vote of thanks was given by Dr Narendra Kumar, Assistant Professor, Department of Education, Central University of Rajasthan.

### **Report of Second Session**

**Sub Theme: NPST: A Road map for Implementation** 

**The Speaker: Prof. Shri Prakash Mani Tripathi**, Vice-Chancellor, Indira Gandhi National Tribal University, Amarkantak, Madhya Pradesh

The session was moderated by Dr T Sangeetha, Assistant Professor, Department of Education.

The session began with the welcome speech by Dr Anjali Sharma, Head, Department of Education; Dean, School of Education.

The Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor Prof. Neeraj Gupta made the introductory remark.

Dr Subhashish Batra, Associate Professor, Department of Social Work, Head, Department of Sports Psychology, introduced the honourable speaker, Prof. Shri Prakash Mani Tripathi, Vice-Chancellor, Indira Gandhi National Tribal University, Amarkantak.

The speaker started by appreciating the topic to which he was invited. He praised for the first time the Samagra policy came, emphasizing all over the development of the individual. It incorporates traditional knowledge as well as modern knowledge. The main focus is on developing good citizenship, focusing on all three aspects of Chintan, Manan, and Adhayanan. We all should be aware of educational psychology and educational objectives. Education is one of the vital tools which helps you in progress. The role of a teacher is crucial who enlightens the individual. He shared that we come across four teachers during our life, beginning from mother being the first teacher at home, in our initial phase., who teaches words and makes us aware of the relationship. At the second level, we come across a teacher in school who gives us subject knowledge. And in higher education, the teacher instils in us the skill and professional knowledge. At the fourth stage, we are left with no one to guide us and here, the Sasthras place an essential role in guiding us. He also talked about the importance of both intrinsic as well as extrinsic development. There is a need to focus on traditional knowledge wherein we can develop our inner sense. Extrinsic development takes place with the help of science and technology, which will help progress in our lives; the teacher plays an important link in all this. He has to focus on individual development, national development as well as the development of humanity. The teacher is a role model in society, and he is assessed at every stage by the students and society, the way s/he speaks, his conduct, behaviour, everything is observed. The teacher has to be continuously curious and a lifelong learner as he is the one who creates the future generation. Skill development is highlighted in the New Education Policy, and various other important components related to holistic development are emphasized. The success of implementation of this Policy NEP 2020 lies in the hands of a teacher. For all this, institutional readiness is needed. Good infrastructure facilities and well-equipped libraries, laboratories should be there. The classrooms need to be good, the place where the students are sitting. The teacher needs to be provided with appropriate infrastructure facilities such as seating arrangements, technology etc.

Nowadays, artificial intelligence is the buzzword. We can have information at the click of a button, but he suggested that teachers should not become the slave of technology but make technology their slaves. Teachers need to trust their knowledge rather than depend on technology; for this, they need to keep updating. It's the era of technology; we are all talking about startups now. NEP 2020 has also taken care of all these aspects. He also referenced the covid scenarios of how the teachers worked hard to cope with the situation.

He emphasized four points that one needs to focus on the sense of inquiry, discussion, discovery, analysis, and synthesis. He gave the example that many people contribute to the literature, art, etc. though they do not hold any formal positions. He emphasized that these people should be identified and brought to the forefront and learn them through their experiences. Their experiences can be utilized, and we can also preserve the culture in this manner.

The teacher needs to work for their continuous professional development. They should think about how to teach the students, what different learning resources they can provide, and what innovations they can bring in their teaching-learning process. All these aspects need to be thought. In future, the promotions of the teachers will not be time-bound one need to perform and develop professionally on their own to get promoted. The teachers have to act as an agent for social change. The teachers have to impart knowledge of constitutional values to their children. Apart from giving subject knowledge, the knowledge of liberal arts will now be given more importance. Importance should be given to sports also. All these need to be included in teaching by the teacher, and to do this, they have first to learn them or gain knowledge in this area.

The speaker also emphasized the need to interact with different teachers and teachers of other educational institutions. We need to create a network and learning environment wherein we can learn from each other's experiences. The teacher can make the students global citizens and also make them brand ambassadors of the nation. We need to prepare them for all fields.

We need to trust our nation and take pride in our nation and the national language. We should focus on self-reliance, find out what is renowned in your neighbourhood. Start appreciating the local resources. We need to take pride in our local heritage. We need to be vocal for locals. These local resources can be later taken to the national level and promote. The teacher needs to take the students from ignorance to knowledge. Every student has the ability and potential now; it is up to the teachers to nurture those potentials.

The session followed the discussion.

Dr Gobind Singh, Assistant Professor, Department of Education, proposed the vote of thanks.






# "NATIONAL PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS FOR TEACHERS (NPST): A STEP TOWARDS PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT OF TEACHERS IN INDIA"

on

### 15th SEPTEMBER, 2021

On the occasion of Shikshak Parv 2021 (commencing from 7<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> September, 2021), Department of Education, Central University of Rajasthan in collaboration with National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE), New Delhi organized one day National webinar on" National Professional Standards for Teachers (NPST): A Step Towards Professional Development of Teachers in India" on 15th September 2021 in online mode through Google meet platform.

The webinar was focused on National Professional Standards for Teachers (NPST), its Needs & concerns and a Roadmap for implementation.

There were two sessions in this programme; the First session was organized on the subtheme "NPST: Need & Concerns", and the second session was organized on the subtheme "NPST: Road Map for Implementation".

### **First Session**

Subtheme: "NPST: Need & Concerns"

The programme started at 12:00 pm with the welcome address by Dr Anjali Sharma, convenor of the National Webinar and Head and Dean School of Education, Central University of Rajasthan. The dignitaries on the event were **Prof. Saket Kushwaha**, **Vice-Chancellor**, **Rajeev Gandhi University**, **Arunachal Pradesh**, **Prof. Saroj Sharma Chairperson**, **National Institute of Open Schooling and Prof. Neeraj Gupta**, **Vice-Chancellor** (i/c), **Central University of Rajasthan**.

The first session was moderated by Dr Rina Godara, Assistant Professor, Department of Education, Central University of Rajasthan.

Dr Anjali Sharma delivered opening remarks and an introduction to the programme. She highlighted the key points of the webinar. Also, she thanked the Ministry of Education along with National Council for Teacher Education Officials, Shri Santosh Kumar Sarangi, IAS Chairperson, NCTE Mrs Kesang Y Sherpa, Member Secretary, NCTE and Mr Dinesh Kumar Chaturvedi, Under Secretary, NCTE, for choosing us to organize this one-day National Webinar.

**Prof. Neeraj Gupta, Vice-Chancellor (i/c),** Central University of Rajasthan, also welcomed the invited eminent speaker and expressed his gratitude for their presence for gracing this event.

Subject Experts, Prof. Saket Kushwaha, Vice-Chancellor, Rajeev Gandhi University, Arunachal Pradesh and Prof. Saroj Sharma, Chairperson, National Institute of Open Schooling, were the dignitaries invited for the first session of the webinar.

At the starting of the session, **Prof. Neeraj Gupta, Vice-Chancellor (i/c), Central University of Rajasthan**, said that it is quite interesting that due to online connectivity, we could be able to connect from Arunachal Pradesh to Rajasthan. He stated about the theme and subthemes of the webinar that it is the most critical topic of concern when we are talking about the implementation of the National Education Policy 2020. Skill and attitude are the two significant areas of concern that are missing among the teachers. In our education system, a teacher is sent to any institution without any training, so there is a need to train our teachers in these two specific areas, i.e. skill and attitude, before sending them to any institution.

**Prof. Saket Kushwaha, Vice-Chancellor, Rajeev Gandhi University, Arunachal Pradesh** focused on the ground reality related to teacher education institutions. He said that in our universities, whether it is Central University or State University, the ratio of teachers is not managed. Due to the scarcity of teachers, institutes fail to release teachers for better training. He also talked about APAR (Annual Performance Appraisal Report). According to him, there is a need to look into the dynamics of differential treatment. He also emphasized that training is also required for future teachers so that they may be able to develop and synthesize the problems from the raw data. He said that teachers fail to build curiosity among our students, so we need to train our teachers in this aspect.

In the second part of the session Dr. Kanak Sharma, Assistant Professor, Department of Education, Central University of Rajasthan welcomed and introduced the second speaker of the session

The second speaker of the session, **Prof. Saroj Sharma, Chairperson, National Institute of Open Schooling**, started her session with the Status of Teacher in Ancient times. She said that the teacher in the olden days shaped the future of society and was highly revered and superior to God. He was most learned. She also traced the development in the field of education by referring to various commissions and committees. She stated that in the 21<sup>st</sup>-century educator, we are looking for characteristics such as adaptor, communicator, learner, visionary, leader, model, collaborator and risk-taker. She defined professional standards as a set of principles, ethics and behaviours that members of a particular professional group need to adapt.

The speaker referenced Sustainable Development Goals (SDG 2030) on professional standards of teachers, which states, "By 2030, substantially increase the supply of qualified teachers, including through international cooperation for teacher training in developing countries, especially least developed countries and small island developing states." It also talks about the "Existence of National Quality Standards for Teachers."

She also discussed NPST and highlighted that there has to be motivation for teachers to enhance teacher education quality, and the high respect for teachers and high status of teaching needs to be restored. These things need to be kept in mind while preparing for NPST. It should focus on Expectation, Competency, Standard for Performance Appraisal and Designing of Preservice teacher education Programme. UNESCO in 2019 also gave domains of professional teaching standards: Knowledge and understanding, practice (Pedagogy) and Teaching Relations (Professional Relationships). Towards the end, the speaker focused on the needs and concerns of the NPST like;

- we need to define the roles of teachers,
- provide the framework for self-learning and self-evaluation,
- make explicit the qualities of a 21<sup>st</sup>-century teacher,
- raise the profession's status, and demonstrate the appropriate level of professional knowledge, practice, and engagement.

What is the way forward now? How do we move ahead? For this, the speaker discussed four professional standard resources: Professional Standard Framework for teachers, Professional Standard Self-development Guide, Professional Standard Assessment tools, Professional Standard Research tools.

The speaker shared her experiences at NIOS how they are working towards the professional development of their teachers. She also shared about the Virtual school initiated by NIOS and NDEAR Scheme of Government. She believed that teachers should also work for their professional development. In these times of pandemic, the teachers have worked on their capacity building and equipped themselves with the new technology. There is an utter need to keep on working on the professional development of teachers. We need to work on their capacity development and ensure that they are ready with 21<sup>st</sup>-century skills.

At the end of the session, the speaker answered the queries of the participants. The programme wrapped up around 1:45 pm. The vote of thanks was given by Dr Narendra Kumar, Assistant Professor, Department of Education, Central University of Rajasthan.

### **Report of Second Session**

**Sub Theme: NPST: A Road map for Implementation** 

**The Speaker: Prof. Shri Prakash Mani Tripathi**, Vice-Chancellor, Indira Gandhi National Tribal University, Amarkantak, Madhya Pradesh

The session was moderated by Dr T Sangeetha, Assistant Professor, Department of Education.

The session began with the welcome speech by Dr Anjali Sharma, Head, Department of Education; Dean, School of Education.

The Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor Prof. Neeraj Gupta made the introductory remark.

Dr Subhashish Batra, Associate Professor, Department of Social Work, Head, Department of Sports Psychology, introduced the honourable speaker, Prof. Shri Prakash Mani Tripathi, Vice-Chancellor, Indira Gandhi National Tribal University, Amarkantak.

The speaker started by appreciating the topic to which he was invited. He praised for the first time the Samagra policy came, emphasizing all over the development of the individual. It incorporates traditional knowledge as well as modern knowledge. The main focus is on developing good citizenship, focusing on all three aspects of Chintan, Manan, and Adhayanan. We all should be aware of educational psychology and educational objectives. Education is one of the vital tools which helps you in progress. The role of a teacher is crucial who enlightens the individual. He shared that we come across four teachers during our life, beginning from mother being the first teacher at home, in our initial phase., who teaches words and makes us aware of the relationship. At the second level, we come across a teacher in school who gives us subject knowledge. And in higher education, the teacher instils in us the skill and professional knowledge. At the fourth stage, we are left with no one to guide us and here, the Sasthras place an essential role in guiding us. He also talked about the importance of both intrinsic as well as extrinsic development. There is a need to focus on traditional knowledge wherein we can develop our inner sense. Extrinsic development takes place with the help of science and technology, which will help progress in our lives; the teacher plays an important link in all this. He has to focus on individual development, national development as well as the development of humanity. The teacher is a role model in society, and he is assessed at every stage by the students and society, the way s/he speaks, his conduct, behaviour, everything is observed. The teacher has to be continuously curious and a lifelong learner as he is the one who creates the future generation. Skill development is highlighted in the New Education Policy, and various other important components related to holistic development are emphasized. The success of implementation of this Policy NEP 2020 lies in the hands of a teacher. For all this, institutional readiness is needed. Good infrastructure facilities and well-equipped libraries, laboratories should be there. The classrooms need to be good, the place where the students are sitting. The teacher needs to be provided with appropriate infrastructure facilities such as seating arrangements, technology etc.

Nowadays, artificial intelligence is the buzzword. We can have information at the click of a button, but he suggested that teachers should not become the slave of technology but make technology their slaves. Teachers need to trust their knowledge rather than depend on technology; for this, they need to keep updating. It's the era of technology; we are all talking about startups now. NEP 2020 has also taken care of all these aspects. He also referenced the covid scenarios of how the teachers worked hard to cope with the situation.

He emphasized four points that one needs to focus on the sense of inquiry, discussion, discovery, analysis, and synthesis. He gave the example that many people contribute to the literature, art, etc. though they do not hold any formal positions. He emphasized that these people should be identified and brought to the forefront and learn them through their experiences. Their experiences can be utilized, and we can also preserve the culture in this manner.

The teacher needs to work for their continuous professional development. They should think about how to teach the students, what different learning resources they can provide, and what innovations they can bring in their teaching-learning process. All these aspects need to be thought. In future, the promotions of the teachers will not be time-bound one need to perform and develop professionally on their own to get promoted. The teachers have to act as an agent for social change. The teachers have to impart knowledge of constitutional values to their children. Apart from giving subject knowledge, the knowledge of liberal arts will now be given more importance. Importance should be given to sports also. All these need to be included in teaching by the teacher, and to do this, they have first to learn them or gain knowledge in this area.

The speaker also emphasized the need to interact with different teachers and teachers of other educational institutions. We need to create a network and learning environment wherein we can learn from each other's experiences. The teacher can make the students global citizens and also make them brand ambassadors of the nation. We need to prepare them for all fields.

We need to trust our nation and take pride in our nation and the national language. We should focus on self-reliance, find out what is renowned in your neighbourhood. Start appreciating the local resources. We need to take pride in our local heritage. We need to be vocal for locals. These local resources can be later taken to the national level and promote. The teacher needs to take the students from ignorance to knowledge. Every student has the ability and potential now; it is up to the teachers to nurture those potentials.

The session followed the discussion.
